A 1973 survey indicated that Treasurer's records provide a 1918 date of construction for this house. The house is not on the 1914 Sanborn map, but is on the 1921 Sanborn map. The house was previously addressed as 264 N. Nevada. The 1932 city directory indicates that this was the home of S.A. and Frances Noyes. Mr. Noyes was proprietor of Noyes Hardware on Main Street. In 1939, Mrs. Noyes was listed here along with daughters Mary and Alice. In 1953-1961 city directories, this was listed as the home of Albert J. Singer, Sr.
