

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One-story frame dwelling with intersecting gables, including gable at middle of roof ridge. Overhanging eaves, ornamental verge boards, composition roofing. Walls clad with lap siding; concrete foundation. Gable faces clad with variegated shingles; projecting front gable features window with triangular lintel which cuts through shingles of gable face. Brick chimney with concrete trim. Center, paneled and glazed door in enclosed porch, which has hipped roof, paired windows, and walls clad with lap siding and is located at angle of intersection of gables.  The porch was enclosed after John W. Hamilton purchased the house in the mid-1940s.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE):

This house was reportedly built by Josiah A. Fowler, one of Denver's early attorneys, in 1888. Fowler was born in Elizabethan, Illinois and came to Colorado in 1883 and taught school near Buena Vista and in Littleton. He studied law in Denver and established a practice in 1890, specializing in county government law. Fowler is not listed in the 1905 city directory for Littleton. The 1920 U.S. Census indicates that this was the home of Canadian carpenter Frank R. Whitcomb, his wife, Margaret, and their six sons. In 1932, farmer W.A. Pearman lived here with his wife, Minnie. In 1939, this was the home of Jack and Clara Whitehead. Jack Whitehead was a lieutenant with the Civilian Conservation Corps headquarters in Littleton.

This house, although altered, reflects Queen Anne style elements applied to smaller dwellings in Littleton in its multiple gables with decorative vergeboards and shingles, its lap siding, and its decorative triangular lintel above the front window.
