HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE): Geneva Village Senior Citizen Housing complex traces its roots in Littleton to the establishment of the Geneva Home by the International Geneva Association, a fraternal and benevolent organization for men employed in the hotel and restaurant business, in 1927. The property had originally been part of a poultry farm and included 4.5 acres of land with a lake. The Geneva Home cared for the needy, old, sick, and incapacitated members of the Association, including many with tuberculosis. In 1964, architect Eugene Sternberg designed Geneva Village, eight buildings with 28 apartments for elderly hotel retirees and their wives. Denver Caterer Max Hummel was instrumental in helping plan the apartments. In 1975, the City of Littleton purchased the complex and the Littleton Housing Authority manages the facility, providing housing for senior citizens of Littleton. This building, located in the southeastern part of the complex, contained two efficiency and one one-bedroom unit numbered 22 through 24.
