

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE):
Geneva Village Senior Citizen Housing complex traces its roots in Littleton to the establishment of the Geneva Home by the International Geneva Association, a fraternal and benevolent organization for men employed in the hotel and restaurant business, in 1927. The property had originally been part of a poultry farm and included 4.5 acres of land with a lake. The Geneva Home cared for the needy, old, sick, and incapacitated members of the Association, including many with tuberculosis. In 1964, architect Eugene Sternberg designed Geneva Village, eight buildings with 28 apartments for elderly hotel retirees and their wives. Denver Caterer Max Hummel was instrumental in helping plan the apartments. In 1975, the City of Littleton purchased the complex and the Littleton Housing Authority manages the facility, providing housing for senior citizens of Littleton. This building, located along Prince Street near the northern end of the complex, contained three two-bedroom and two one-bedroom units numbered 5 through 9.

This building is less than fifty years old and does not yet possess historical significance. When the building reaches fifty years of age, it may be considered part of a National Register eligible historic district if it maintains historic integrity and will be significant for its historical ties to the International Geneva Association and its development of the Geneva Village complex. The district will be significant for its representation of 1960s retirement home construction and as representative of the work of architect Eugene Sternberg.
