


ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One-story gabled L plan building; composition roofing. Large paved parking lot in angle of the L on southwest side of building. Design of building has many elements seen in the residential designs in the neighborhood, such as lap siding with corner boards and porches with wood railings and columns. Front gable portion of the building has an inset porch; face of gable is glazed with multiple lights. Porch has columns and low stick balustrade; sliding doors open onto porch. Rectangular, fixed-light windows along south elevation. West side of rear L has tall gable roof open structure leading to main entrance. Along the west elevation is another porch with a shed roof supported by round columns with low balustrade; several openings onto porch.
