


| ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two-story commercial office building with flat roof; shingled mansard overhang across sides. Linear plan with exterior walls of rough-faced cast blocks painted white; concrete foundation. Building sited on the depth of the lot with the west end of the building facing the street. There is a paved parking lot on the south side. The walls are divided into five bays by pilasters, with a rectangular ell at the rear. Fixed-light windows on the south and north sides are continuous bands in each bay on both floors. The west end has windows on the second floor only. Entrance under shed roof porch in the ell at the east rear of building. This site previously held one of the Littleton's most distinguished residences, the Samuel T. Culp house. The two-story residence had a massive stone foundation, brick first story, and shingled second story, and was notable for its many gables and tall brick chimneys. The house, erected about 1881, was destroyed by an arson fire and demolished in 1974.
