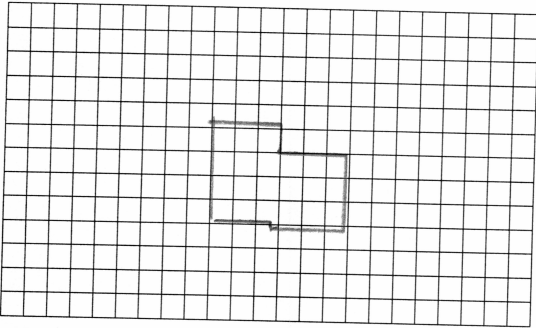

This house appears on Sanborn maps of 1914-1949 and the Littleton Water Supply Map of 1912. The 1905 city directory indicates that this was the home of A.F. Goddard, who worked as county surveyor. The 1920 U.S. Census listed Olisetta Wagner as the occupant of this house, along with two boarders. In 1932 and 1939, Al W. and Florence Weber were listed in city directories for this address. Mr. Weber was employed with the Denver Mutual Water Works. In 1939, Clinton and Marie Eberhardt also lived here. Mr. Eberhardt was an engineer.
