

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE): This transit waiting center was erected in 1984 by the Regional Transportation District and designed by Hoover Berg Desmond, Architects. The structure was designed to allow buses and cars to stop on opposite sides of the double loaded island and provides shelter for waiting passengers. This project received the 1984 Design Award from the American Institute of Architects in Colorado.
