


<b>HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE):</b> This house does not appear on the 1900 Sanborn map, but H.J. Wehrly, a blacksmith, is listed at this address in the 1905 city directory and the house appears on the 1908 Sanborn map. Associated with the house was a blacksmith shop. In 1905, H. J. Wehrly established a blacksmith shop on N. Nevada Ave. After three or four years, he built a blacksmith shop on S. Curtice which was then associated with this residence. About 1913, the Curtice St. shop was sold to John and James Hoskin. Henry and Alice Wehrly were listed at this address in the 1920 Census, when Mr. Wehrly was 62 years old. In 1932 and 1939, J.E. & Alice (Nettie) Murray were listed at this address.
