

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND: This house, previously addressed as 191 and	193 N. Sherman., was b	uilt in 1926 according	to the Arapahoe Cou	inty Assessor.	
The obituary of Mariorie Malcolm Freppel in t	the files of the Littleton H	storical Museum state	es that this house wa	s built by druggist	
E.D. Eson. In 1938 this was the residence of	Beulah Louisa Davies, a	teacher, who was bor	n in Idaho Springs in	1903 and moved	
to Littleton in 1906. Her parents were John High and attended college in Kansas. She tau	and Mary Davies, who liv	ed at 1797 Powers. Bi	od and Littleton and I	became the last	
Arapahoe County superintendent of schools.	She later lived at her fam	ily home on Powers a	nd died in 1986. By	the early 1950s,	
this was the home of George and Marjorie Ma	alcolm. Mr. Malcolm's fa	nily moved to Littletor	n about 1913 becaus	e of his mother's	
health. His father, J.D. Malcolm, operated a	tire store on Main Street.	George attended Bar	nes Business School i	in Denver and	
went to work for Littleton State Bank (later L continuing to serve on the board of directors	ittleton National Bank). F	e became cashier and	ved as mayor in 1948	3-1952, widening	
Main Street, paving many city streets, enlarg	ing the town'swater capa	city, and erecting a me	odern sewage dispos	al facility. In	
1938 he married Marjorie Langworthy, who s	ucceeded him on the ban	k board of directors. I	Mr. Malcolm acquired	d buildings on Main	
Street and renovated them. He was a found	er of the Arapahoe Count	ry Club and president	of the Welshire golf a	association. His
