Bike Bus Basics



What is a Bike Bus?

Students can ride or roll with or without their parents to the school to learn safe routes in their neighborhood. Use your school's <u>School Route Planner map</u> to identify the closest sign, or "stop" near you. Meet up with other riders along your route as you follow the newly installed School Route signs to your school!

Caregiver Roles

- Caregivers are encouraged to use the unique Schoolpool link for their student's school to find other students interested in biking to school.
- For additional safety on the ride, caregivers are also encouraged to ride along at the front and in the rear.

Student Roles

- Have fun! This is about celebrating the joy of riding a bike and creating community with fellow students.
- Follow all the rules of the road and practice safe biking habits.

Safety Tips for Biking

Be Predicatable

Obey all stop signs, traffic signals, and guidance from crossing guards. Use hand signals to tell other road users where you're going.

Be Alert

Watch out for people driving turning left or right, or coming out of driveways. Don't wear headphones or use a cell phone while biking.

Wear Your Helmet

Make sure that it fits properly: snug and level on your head, just above your eyebrows.

Follow the Rules

Ride in the same direction as other vehicles. Bicyclists and drivers follow the same rules of the road.

ABC Quick Check

Performing an ABC Quick Check only takes a few minutes and can identify any issues that might affect your ride!

A: AIR

Pinch the tires. They should be hard.

B: BRAKES


Test to make sure they work and do not rub the tire.

C: CHAIN

Make sure the chain is clean and running smooth when you pedal.

O: QUICK CHECK

Check "quick release levers" and other bolts to make sure they are tight.
